When you find yourself surrounded by ideas you do not subscribe to, laws you cannot uphold and truths you're not able to believe, home can feel like a frightening place to be.

The award-winning Aakash Odedra Company and an extraordinary ensemble of Turkish dancers present *#JeSuis (in progress)*, inspired by personal stories of conflict, media manipulation, displacement and identity, wrapped up in the wider geopolitical issues of life in a homeland that doesn't know the meaning of "home" anymore.

Following the attacks in Paris in January 2015, the hashtag #JeSuisCharlie trended to show camaraderie for lives lost and freedom of expression. During some early choreographic research, the dancers highlighted the disparity of worldwide media coverage and public sympathy between first-world countries and those countries where war and casualties seem to be a daily given. *#JeSuis* became the title for this first ensemble project of AOC to pay tribute to the notion that life matters in every corner of the world.

The R&D for #*JeSuis* revolved around the strangulation of freedom speech; the role conflict/regime plays leading to people being displaced or forced to flee; the media misrepresentation of lives caught up in conflict; and the xenophobic rise in Western countries.

#JeSuis is a plea to say I count, I matter, I exist; but also: *"We Are"*.

The work-in-progress version will be seen at Zoo Southside, Edinburgh Festival Fringe and Journey's Festival International in Leicester (Curve Theatre), Manchester (Contact Theatre) and Portsmouth (Theatre Royal Portsmouth).

#JeSuis will then be developed further in Autumn 2017 and Spring 2018 with a final residency and world premiere at The Arts Center at NYU Abu Dhabi on 7-9 February 2018.
